Federal Funding for Clean Water SRF Projects Cut by \$22.9 Million

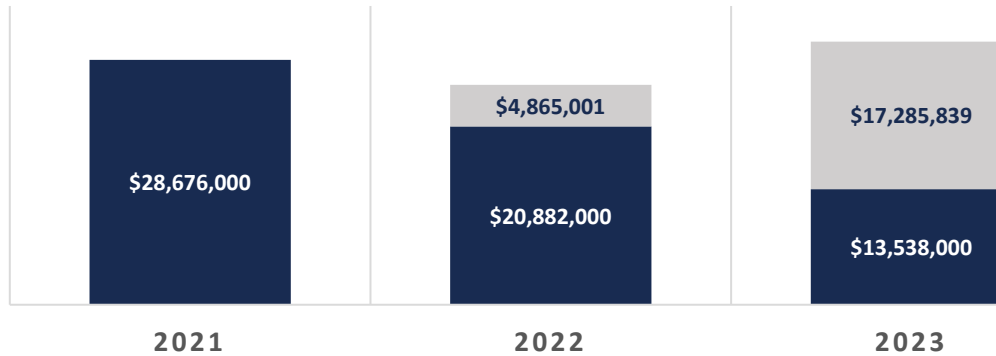


IMPACT OF EARMARKS

Over the last two years, more than \$22.9 million in federal funding has been cut from the North Carolina Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for congressional earmarks.

Funding for congressional earmarks offsets cuts to the SRFs.

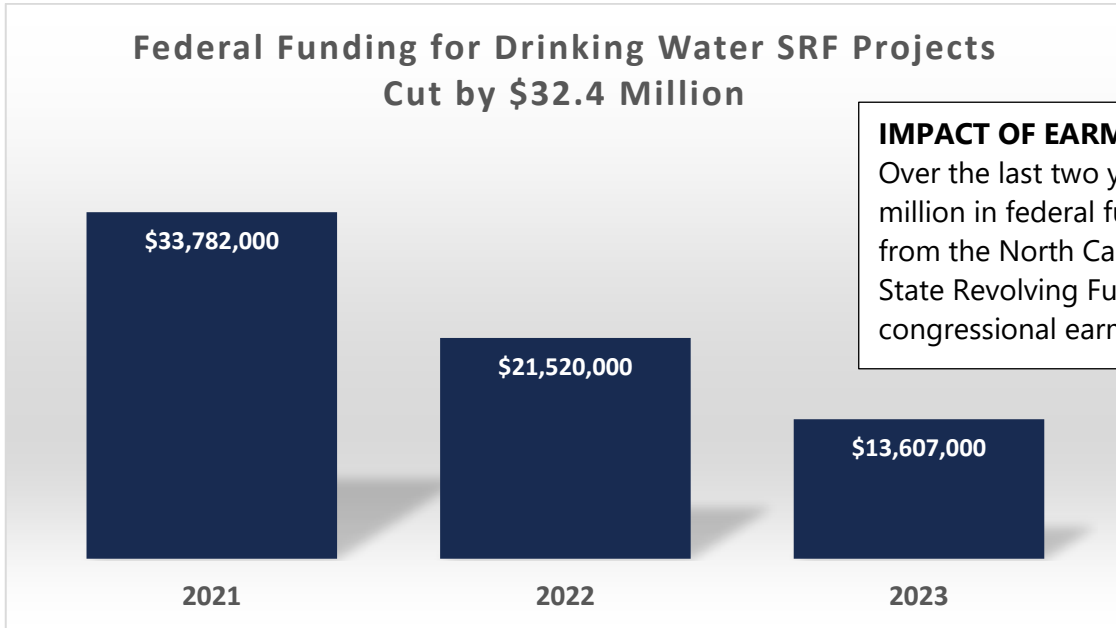
FACT:

Since earmarks returned in 2022, net federal funding for clean water projects in North Carolina (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$781,000.



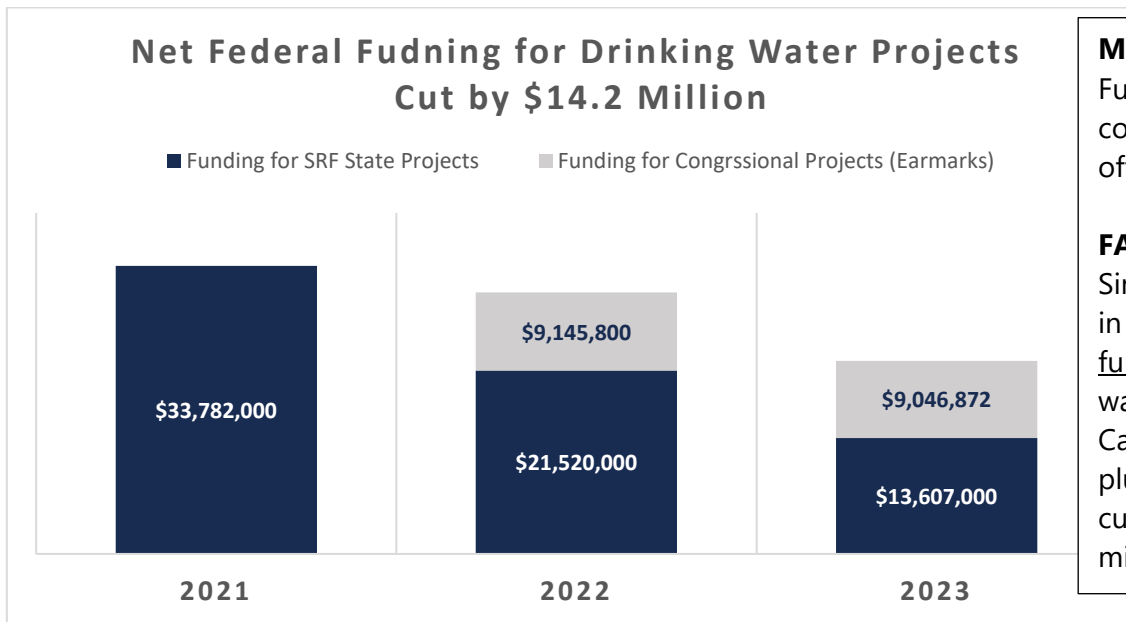

IMPACT OF EARMARKS
Over the last two years, more than \$32.4 million in federal funding has been cut from the North Carolina Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for congressional earmarks.

The allotment formula for the Drinking Water SRF was updated in 2023 based on the result of the 7th Drinking Water Needs Survey.



MYTH:
Funding for congressional earmarks offsets cuts to the SRFs.

FACT:
Since earmarks returned in 2022, net federal funding for drinking water projects in North Carolina (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$14.2 million.

The allotment formula for the Drinking Water SRF was updated in 2023 based on the result of the 7th Drinking Water Needs Survey.
