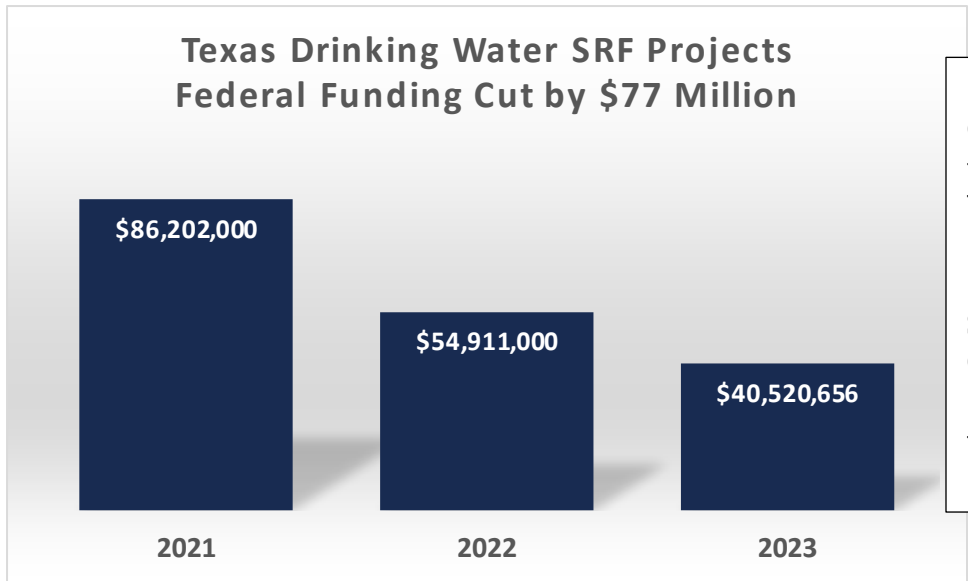


Impact of Earmarks on Funding for Water Infrastructure

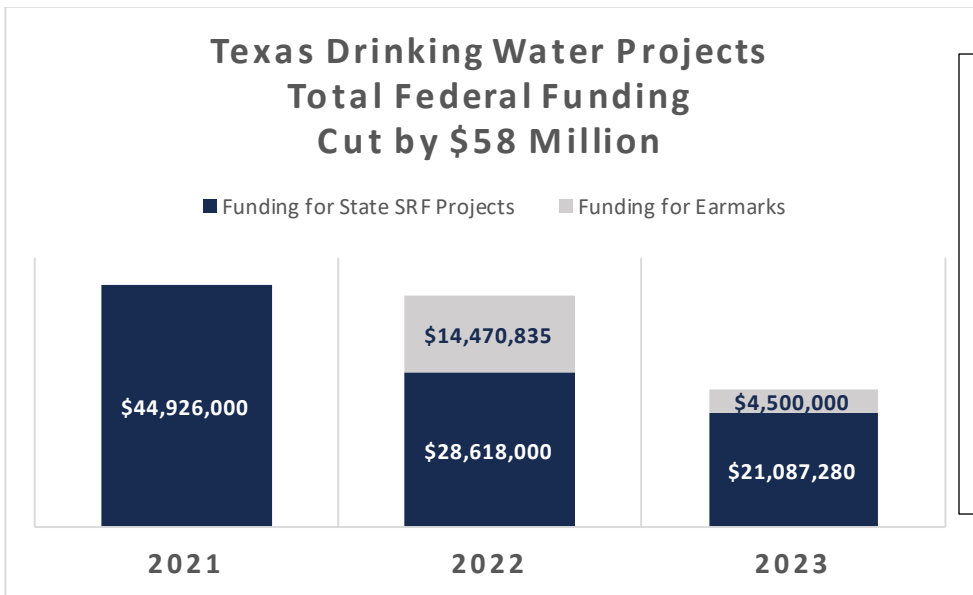
Texas: Drinking Water Projects



BEFORE EARMARKS:
Congress provided annual funding of \$86 million to the Texas Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF).

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED:
Over the last two years, nearly \$77 million has been cut from the Texas Drinking Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.



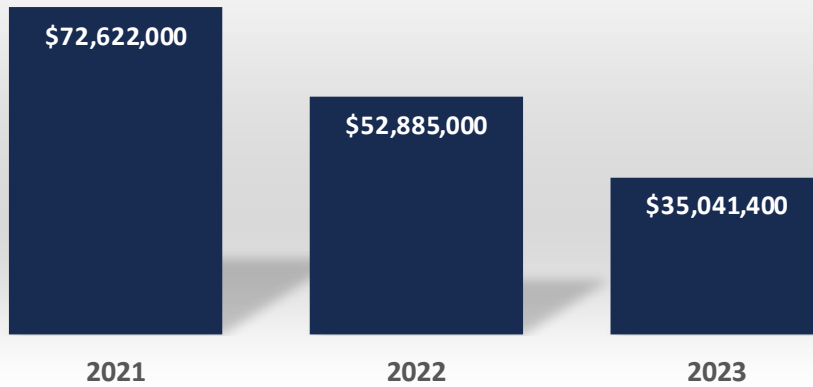
MYTH:
Funding for earmarks makes up for the cuts to the SRFs.

FACT:
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for drinking water projects in Texas, including state SRF projects and earmarks, has been cut by more than \$58 million.

Note: The 2023 SRF allotment is an estimate based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.

Impact of Earmarks on Funding Texas: Clean Water Projects

Texas Clean Water SRF Projects
Federal Funding Cut by \$57 Million



Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.

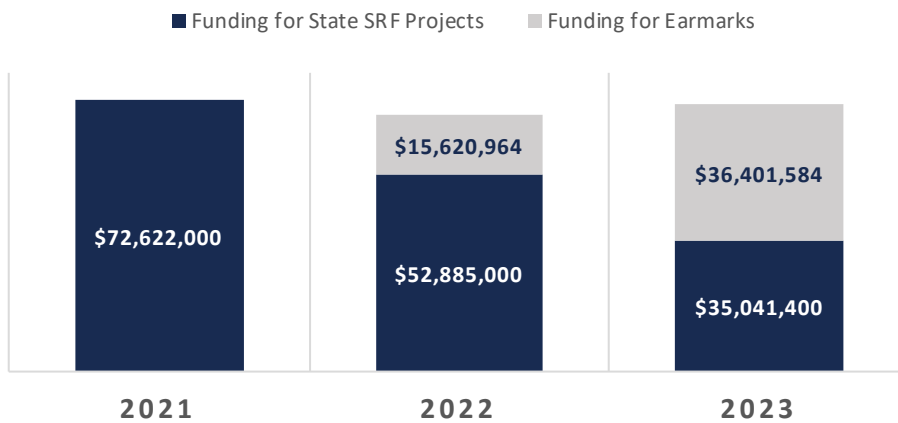
BEFORE EARMARKS:

Congress provided annual funding of \$72 million to the Texas Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF).

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED:

Over the last two years, more than \$57 million has been cut from the Texas Clean Water SRF to pay for earmarks.
