To protect the health of the people of Washington State by assuring safe and reliable drinking water.




Washington State Water System Statistics

Active Number of Washington State Group A and Group B Public Water Systems

Community (COMM)	2,219
Non-transient non-community (NTNC)	322
Transient non-community (TNC)	<u>1,576</u>
Total Group A Water Systems	4,117
Total Group B Water Systems	<u>13,390</u>
Total Group A & Group B Water Systems	17,355

How much money is actually needed?

- According to the needs survey, EPA found that the nation's 53,000 community water systems and 21,400 not-for-profit non-community water systems will need to invest an estimated \$334.8 billion between 2007 and 2027.
- For Washington state, that means we need to invest \$9,756,000,000



DWSRF Infrastructure Loan Dollars Invested in Washington 1997–2014

**\$ 726,920,071.98 for
520 contracts**

Do the math

- If Washington state needs \$9.756 Billion from 2007–2027
- That's about \$487 Million a year
- And Washington state DWSRF has funded \$726 million from 1997–2014
- That's about \$43 Million a year
- That's about \$444 Million shortfall each year

So how are we going to fix it?

- **Maximizing Resources!**
- We are a group of one or two folks from each funding agency
- We get together monthly and compare funding lists
- We try to come up with funding solutions
