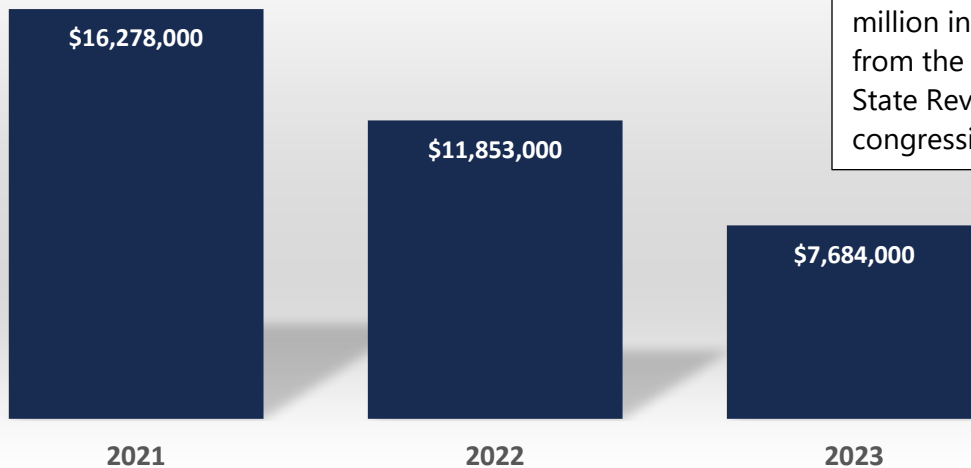

Cut by \$13 Million

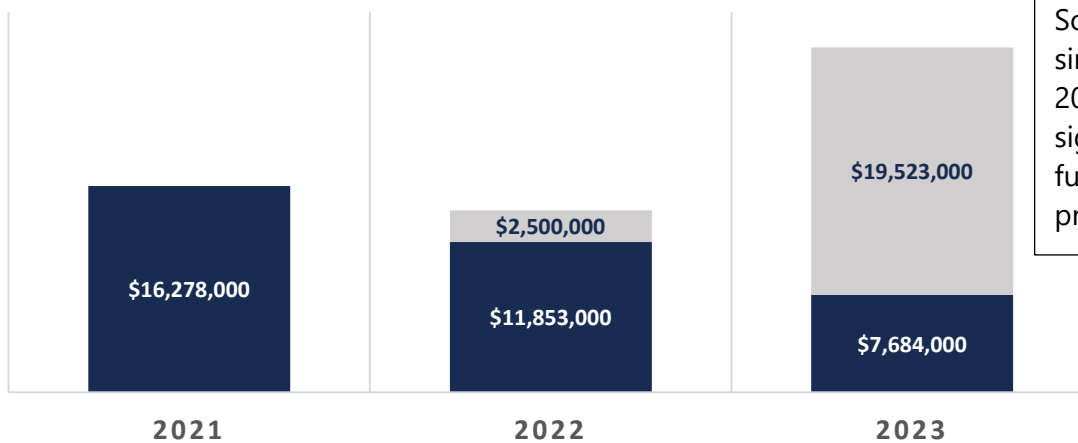


IMPACT OF EARMARKS

Over the last two years, more than \$13 million in federal funding has been cut from the South Carolina Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for congressional earmarks.

■ Funding for SRF State Projects ■ Funding for Congressional Projects (Earmarks)



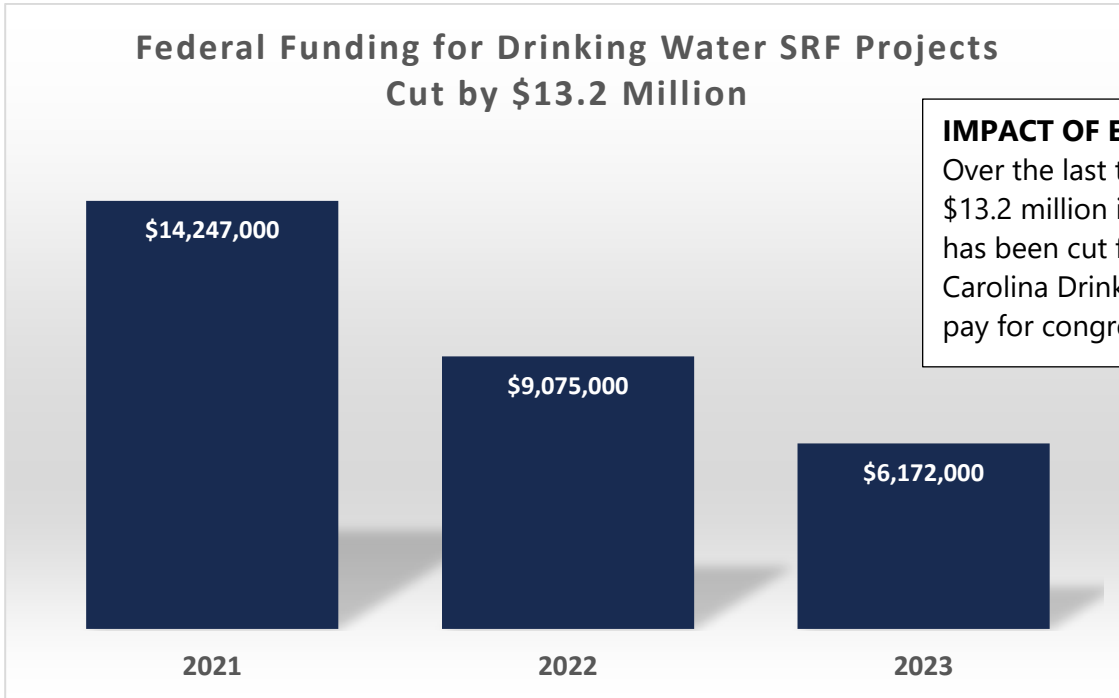
IMPACT OF EARMARKS

While net federal funding for clean water projects in South Carolina increased since earmarks returned in 2022, funding for earmarks significantly exceeded funding for SRF priority projects.



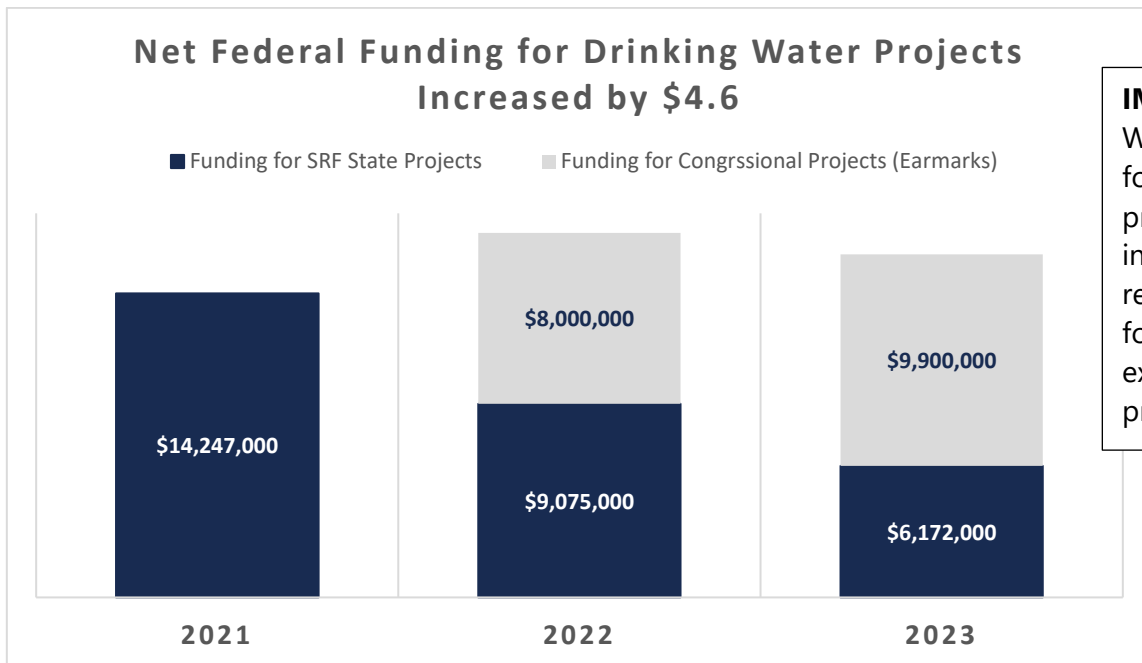
