Cut by \$30.3 Million**

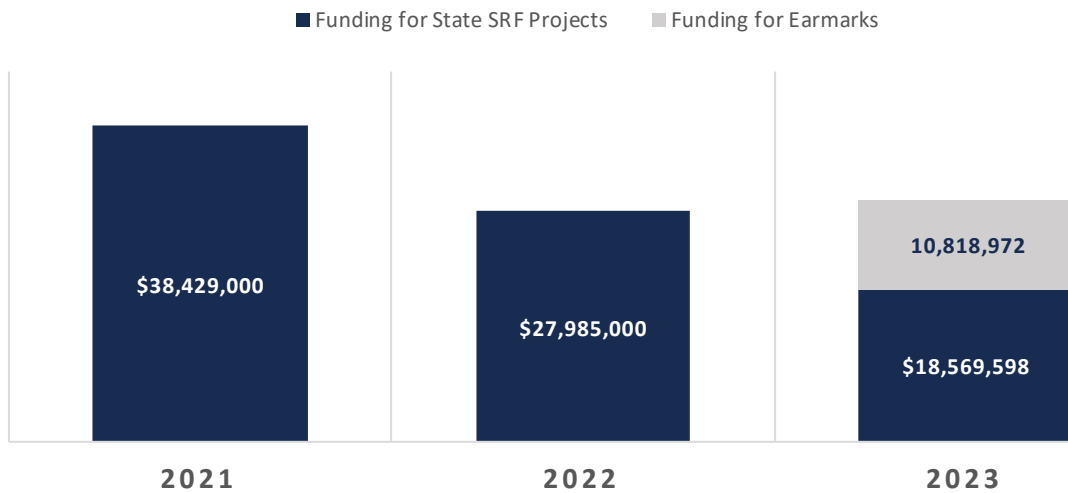


SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED

Over the last two years, more than \$30.3 million has been cut from the Maryland Clean Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.

FACT:

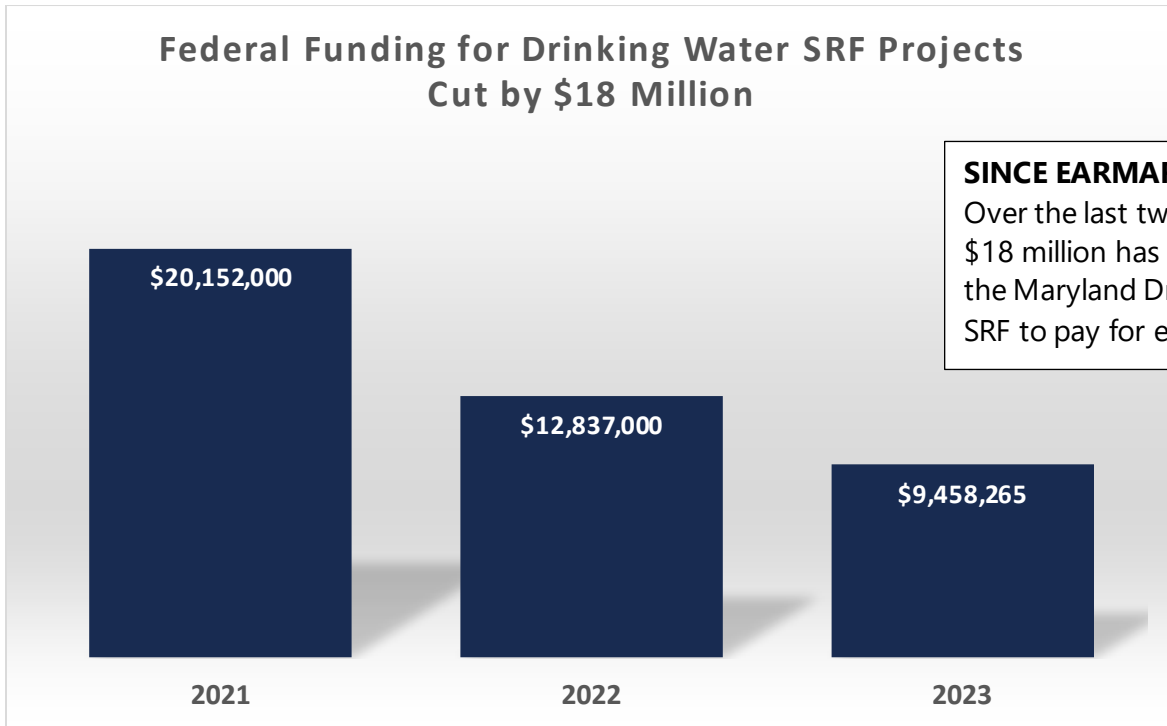
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for clean water projects in Maryland (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$19.4 million.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.



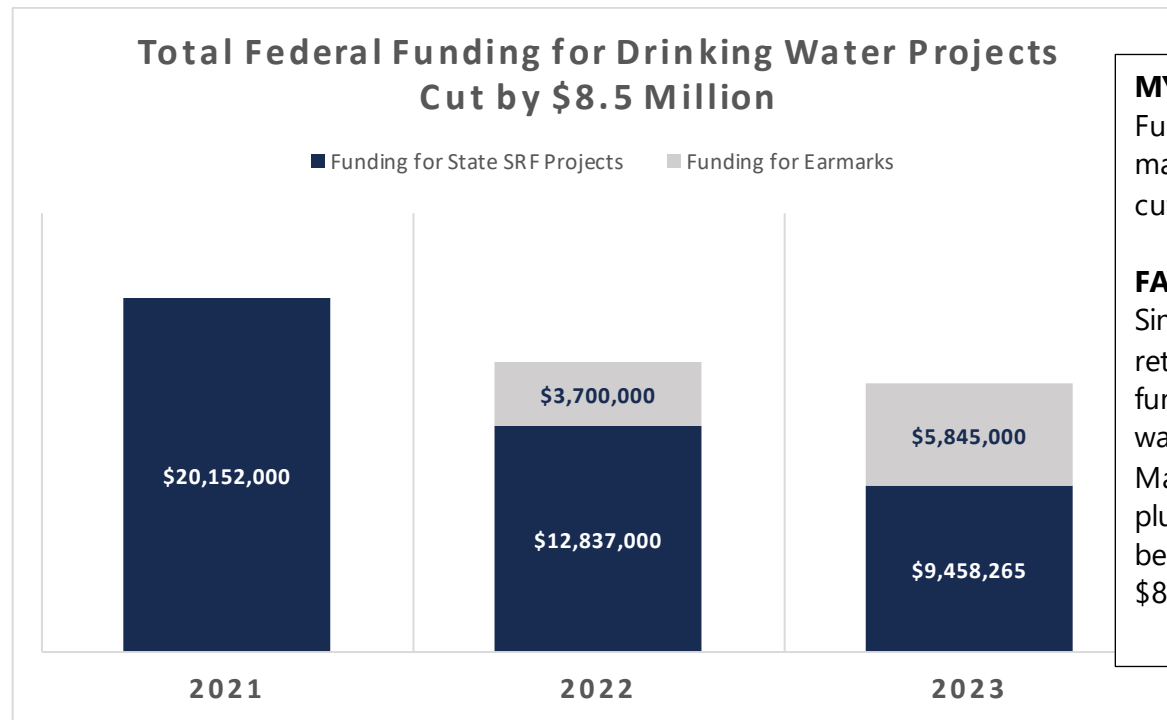
COUNCIL OF INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCING AUTHORITIES

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED:
Over the last two years, nearly \$18 million has been cut from the Maryland Drinking Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.



MYTH:
Funding for earmarks makes up for funding cuts to the SRFs.

FACT:
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for drinking water projects in Maryland (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$8.5 million.

Note: The 2023 SRF allotment is an estimate based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.
