# CWSRF BIL EC Funding

- ✔ Grant funding up to 100% of eligible project costs, up to a maximum amount of \$25 million.
- ✔ Additional Subsidy will be offered in Project Priority Score order.



# 2022 BIL EC Funding (2023 IUP)

## Remediation of Nonpoint Source Pollution

- ✓ Contaminated sites (Inactive Landfills, Airports, Firefighting Foam)
- ✓ EPA Approved NPS Management Program
- ✓ Must benefit disadvantaged community
