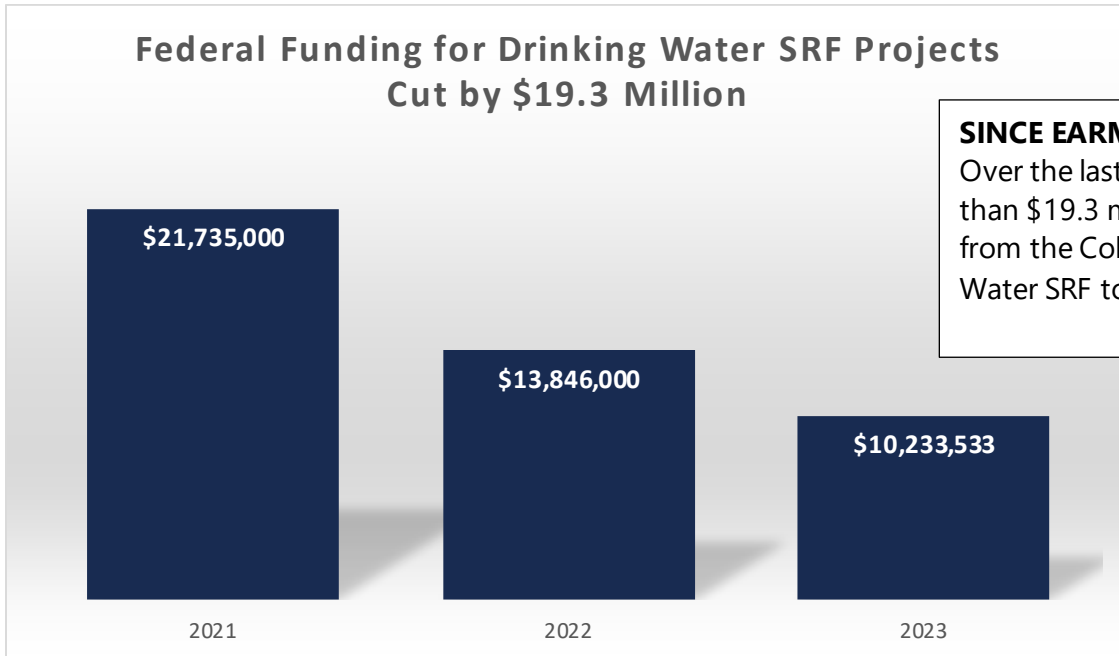
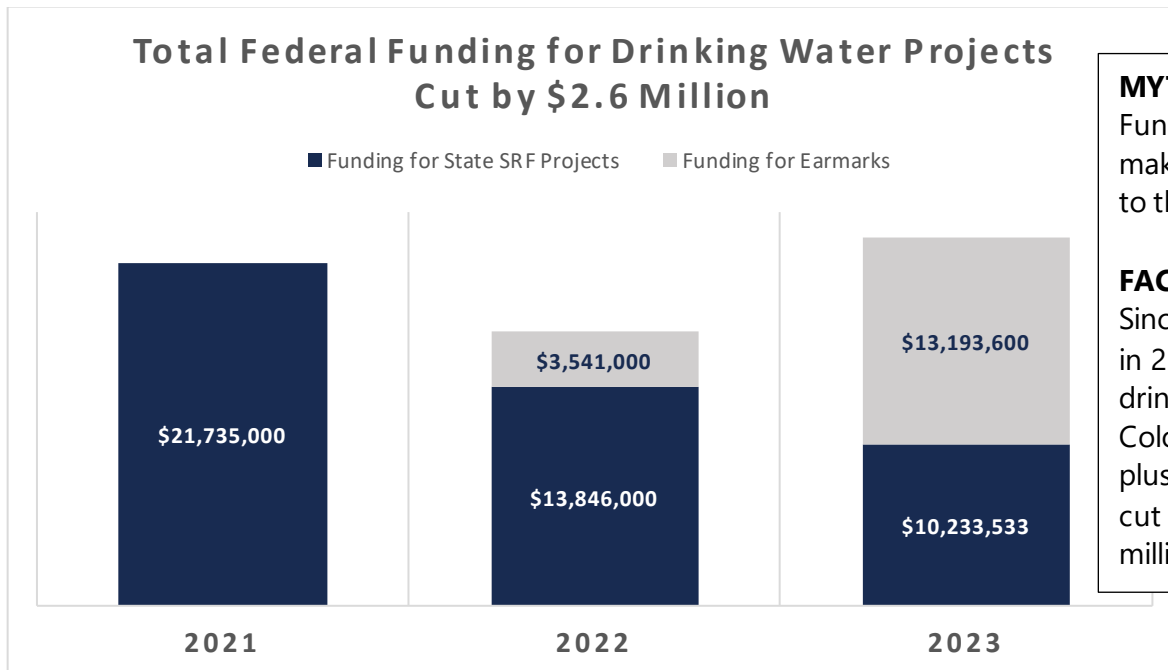


Colorado: Annual Federal Funding for Drinking Water Projects



SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED
Over the last two years, more than \$19.3 million has been cut from the Colorado Drinking Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.

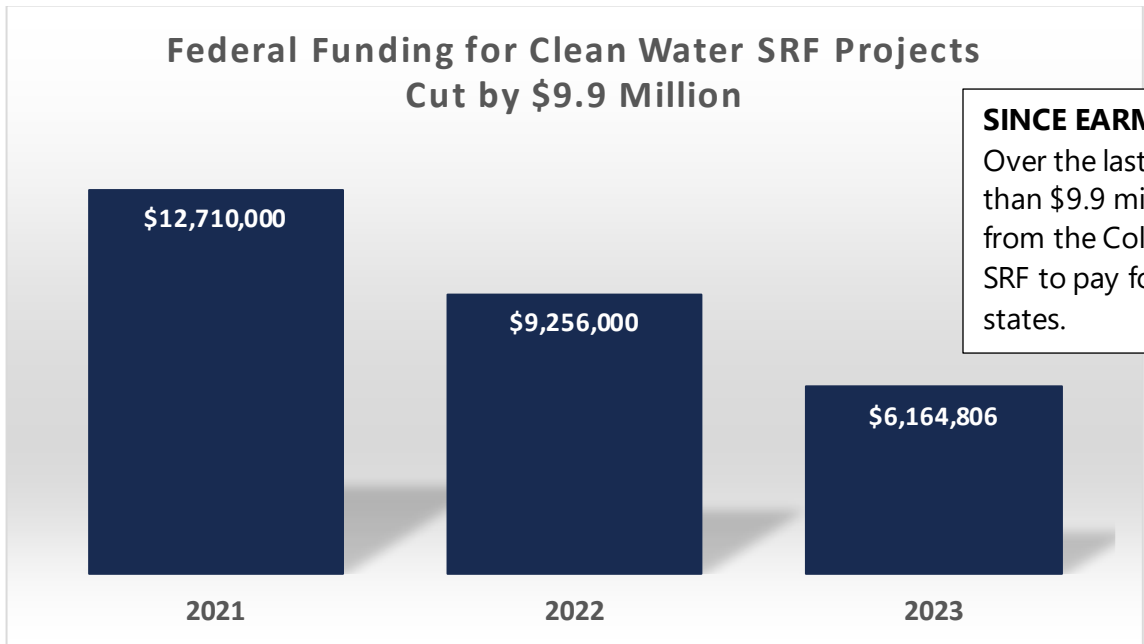


MYTH:
Funding for earmarks makes up for funding cuts to the SRFs.

FACT:
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for drinking water projects in Colorado (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$2.6 million.

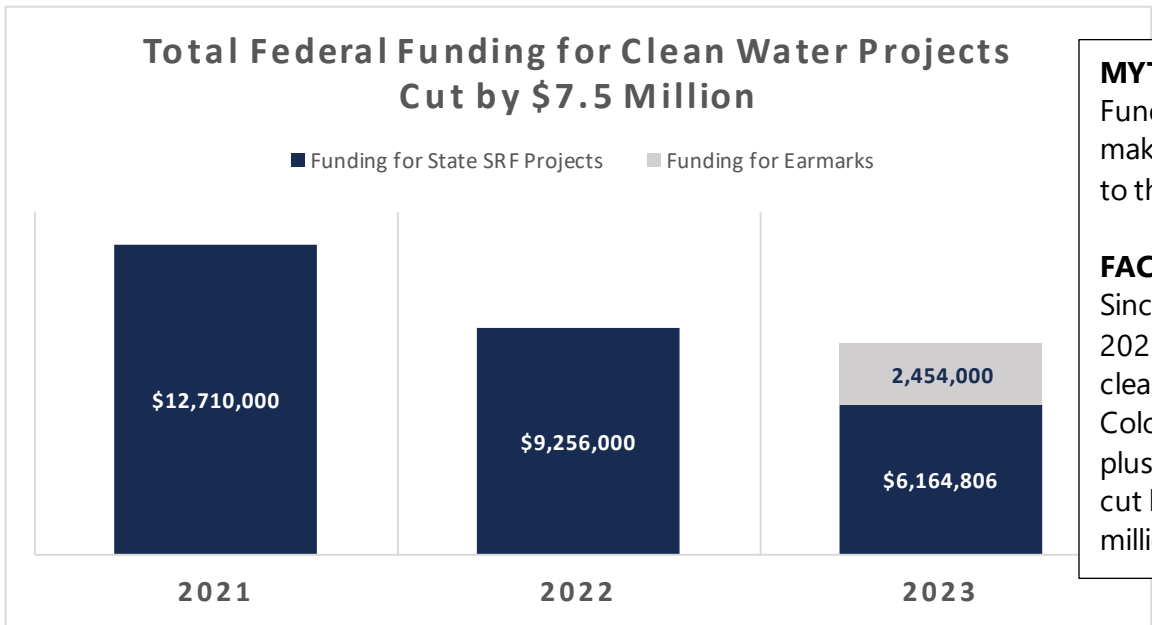
Note: The 2023 SRF allotment is an estimate based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED
Over the last two years, more than \$9.9 million has been cut from the Colorado Clean Water SRF to pay for earmarks in other states.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.

Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for clean water projects in Colorado (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$7.5 million.
