### Federal Funding for Clean Water SRF Projects Cut by \$19.8 Million

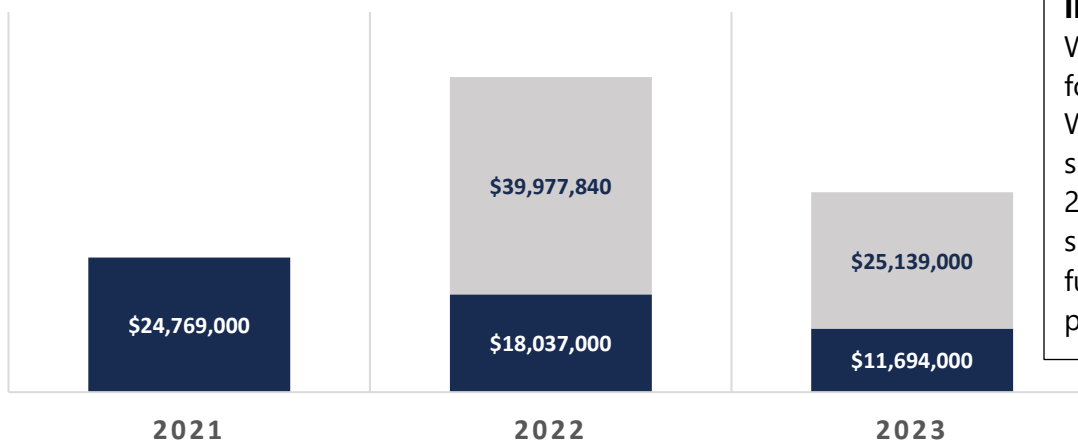


#### IMPACT OF EARMARKS

Over the last two years, more than \$19.8 million in federal funding has been cut from the West Virginia Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for congressional earmarks.

### Net Federal Funding for Clean Water Projects Increased by \$45.3 Million

■ Funding for SRF State Projects    ■ Funding for Congressional Projects (Earmarks)



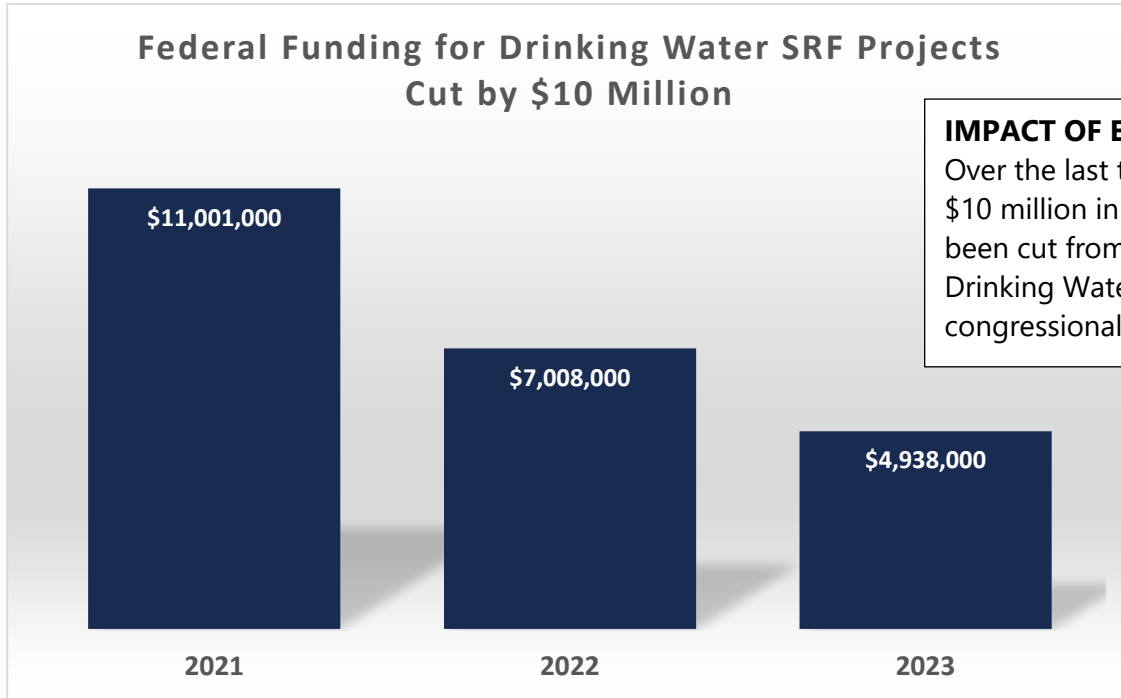
#### IMPACT OF EARMARKS

While net federal funding for clean water projects in West Virginia increased since earmarks returned in 2022, funding for earmarks significantly exceeded funding for SRF priority projects.



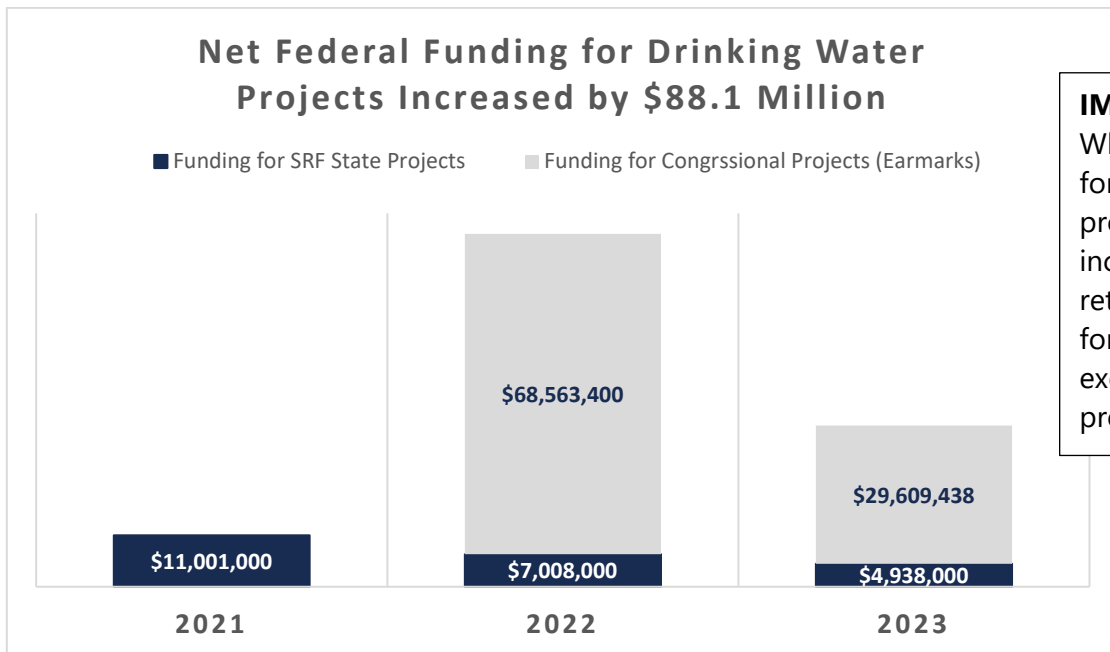

**IMPACT OF EARMARKS**  
Over the last two years, more than \$10 million in federal funding has been cut from the West Virginia Drinking Water SRF to pay for congressional earmarks.
