

2024 Federal Funding for Clean Water State Revolving Funds (SRFs)

Draconian Cuts to Federal Funding Jeopardize Public Health and Environmental Protection.

Congress is proposing unprecedented cuts to annual federal funding for the Clean Water SRFs, which provide subsidized loans for water infrastructure that protects public health and the environment.

- In the short-term, cuts to annual funding threaten the availability of affordable financing for water infrastructure projects that reduce risk to human health and protect water quality, especially in small, rural and disadvantaged communities that can't qualify for other financing.
- In the long-term, cuts to annual federal funding permanently eliminate a source of recurring revenue from loan repayments to meet the never-ending need to replace, repair and rehabilitate the nation's aging water infrastructure.

Restore Federal Funding and Financial Integrity to the Clean Water SRFs.

- Fully fund the Clean Water SRF to 2024 authorized amount of \$3 billion.
- Stop diverting hundreds of millions in federal funding from SRF state projects to pay for congressional earmarks. Fund congressional projects in addition to, rather than in lieu of, SRF state projects.
