Cut by \$6.4 Million

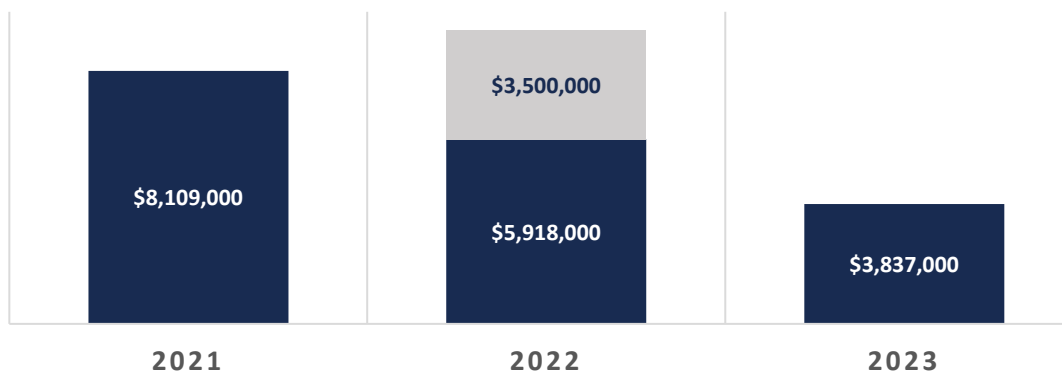


IMPACT OF EARMARKS

Over the last two years, more than \$6.4 million in federal funding has been cut from the Nebraska Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for congressional earmarks.

Funding for congressional earmarks offsets cuts to the SRFs.

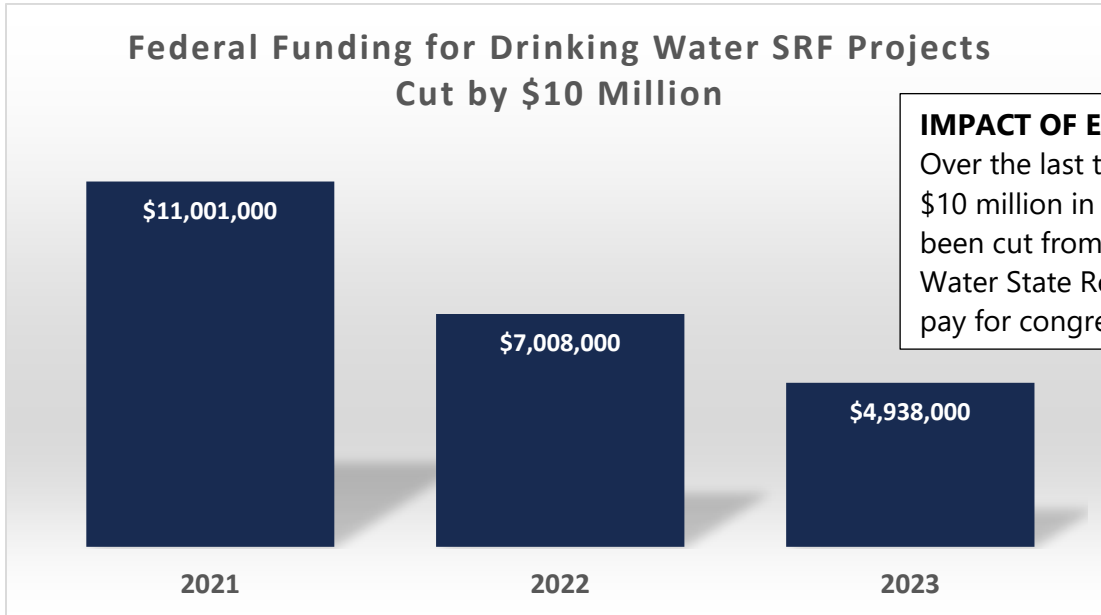
FACT:

Since earmarks returned in 2022, net federal funding for clean water projects in Nebraska (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$2.9 million.



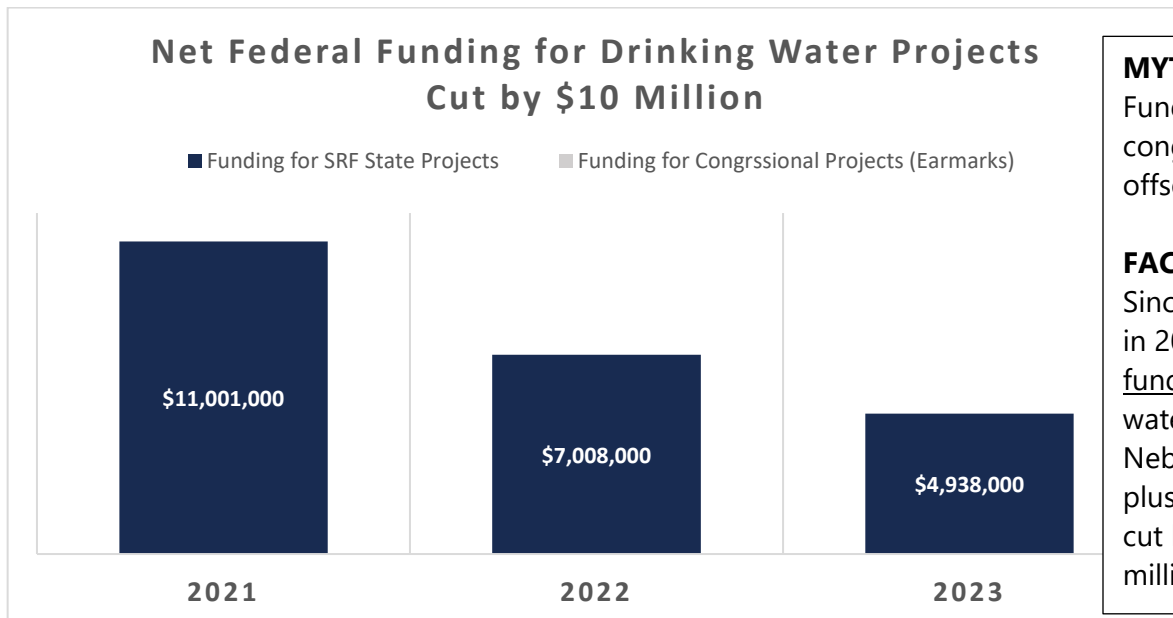

IMPACT OF EARMARKS
