Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.

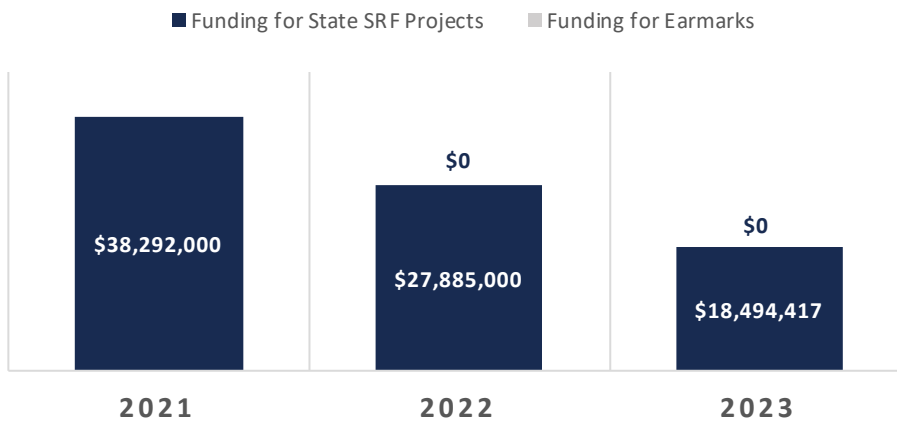
BEFORE EARMARKS:

Congress provided annual funding of \$38 million to the Indiana Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF).

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED:

Over the last two years, more than \$30 million has been cut from the Indiana Clean Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

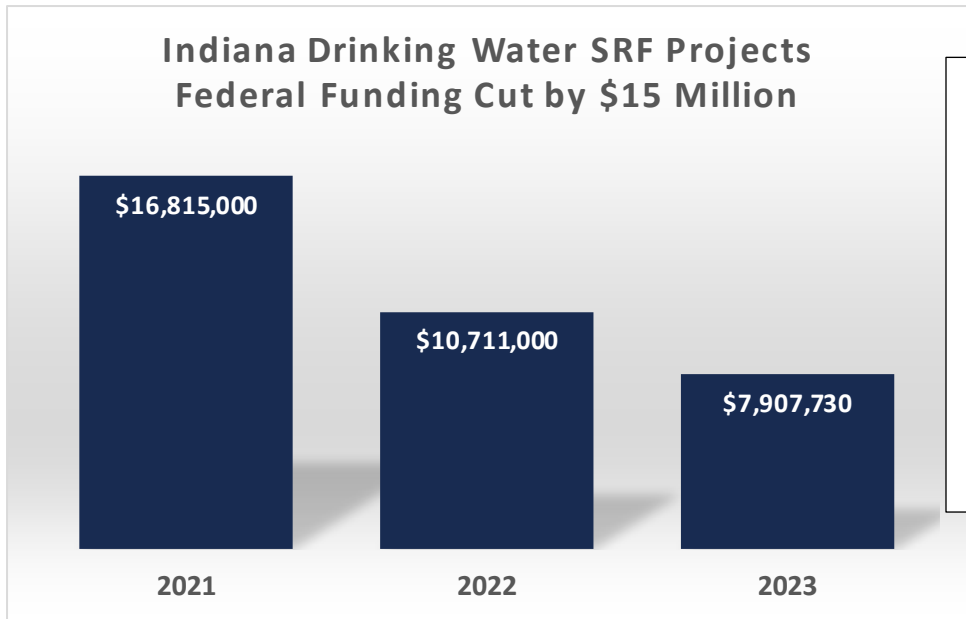
MYTH:

Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for clean water projects in Indiana, including SRF projects and earmarks, has been cut by more than \$30 million.

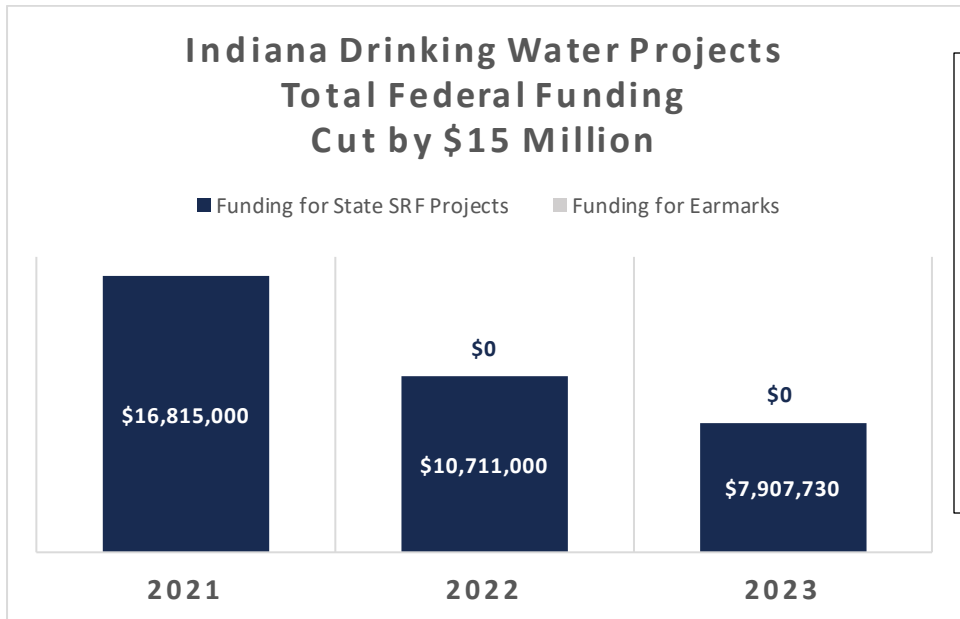
Impact of Earmarks on Funding for Water Infrastructure Indiana: Drinking Water Projects



BEFORE EARMARKS:
Congress provided annual funding of nearly \$17 million to the Indiana Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF).

SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED:
Over the last two years, more than \$15 million has been cut from the Texas Drinking Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.



MYTH:
Funding for earmarks makes up for the cuts to the SRFs.

FACT:
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for drinking water projects in Indiana, including state SRF projects and earmarks, has been cut by more than \$15 million.
