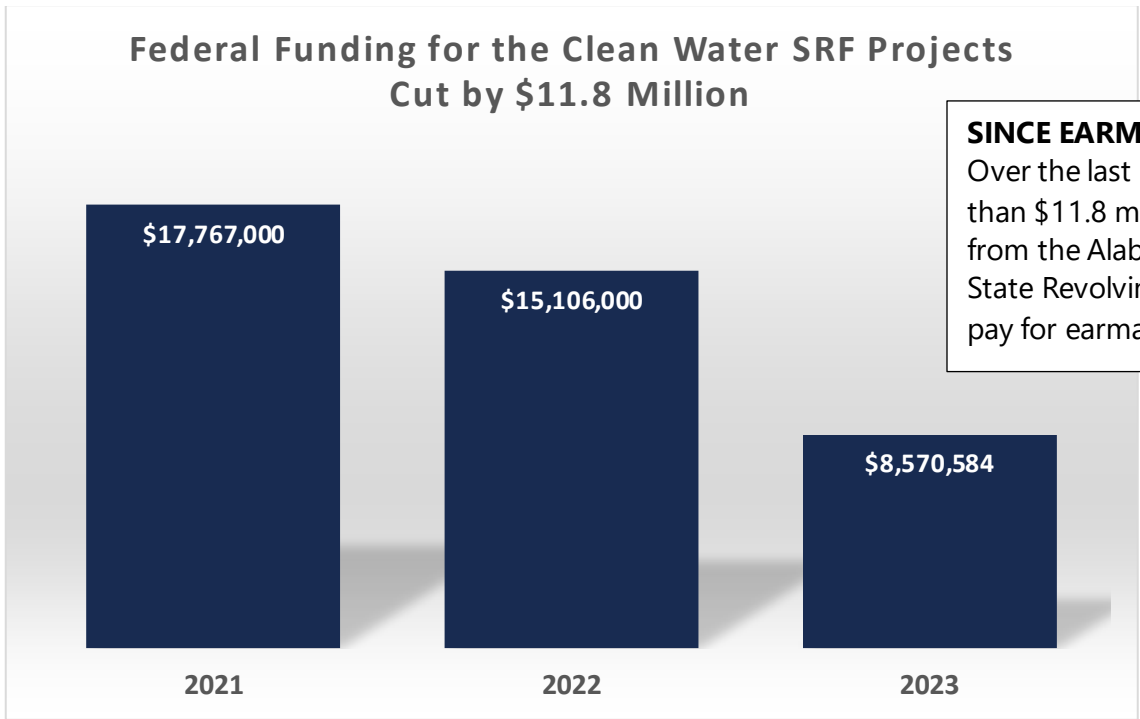
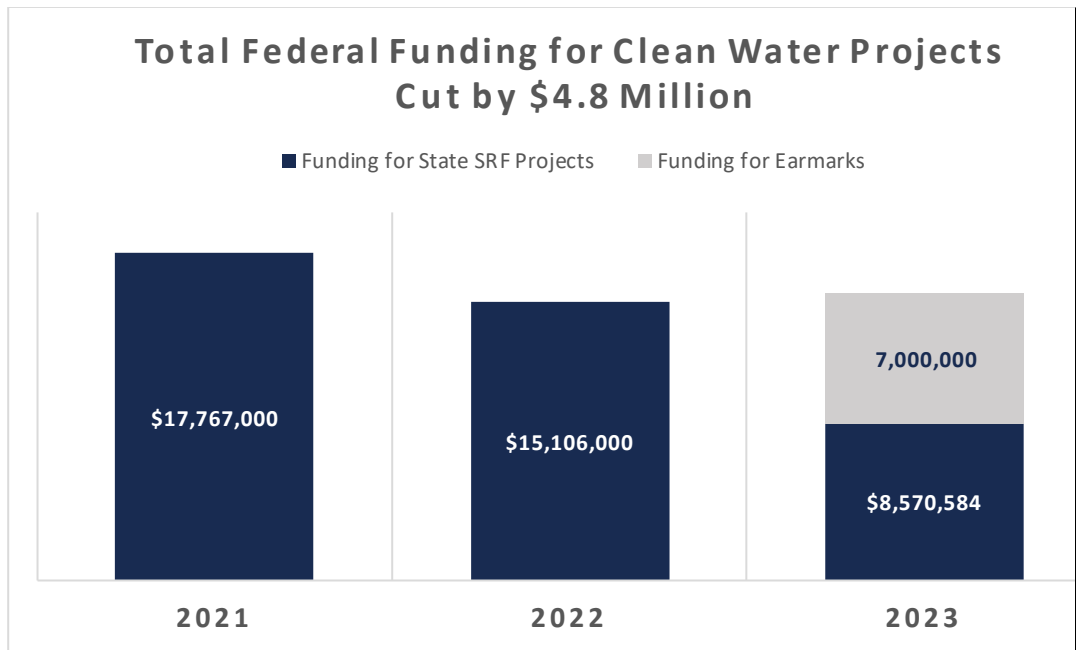


# Alabama: Annual Federal Funding for Clean Water Projects



**SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED**  
Over the last two years, more than \$11.8 million has been cut from the Alabama Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.



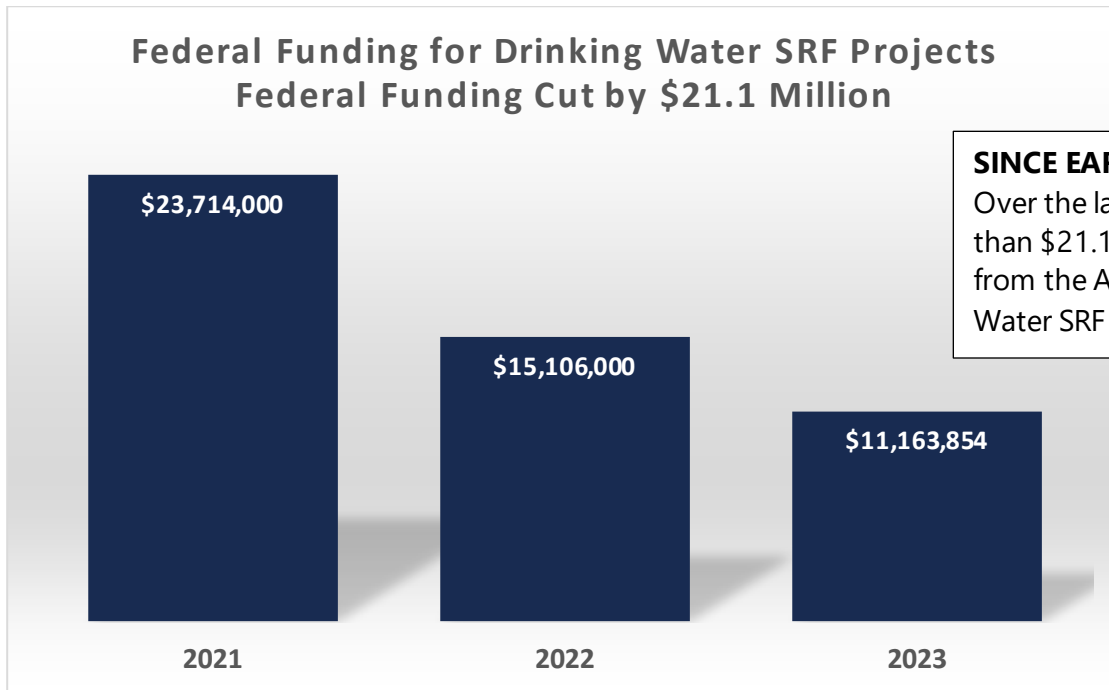
**MYTH:**  
Funding for earmarks makes up for funding cuts to the SRFs.

**FACT:**  
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for clean water projects in Alabama (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$4.8 million.

In 2023, nearly half of total funding – \$7 million – went to just two earmarked projects, leaving just \$8.57 million for projects in the rest of the state.

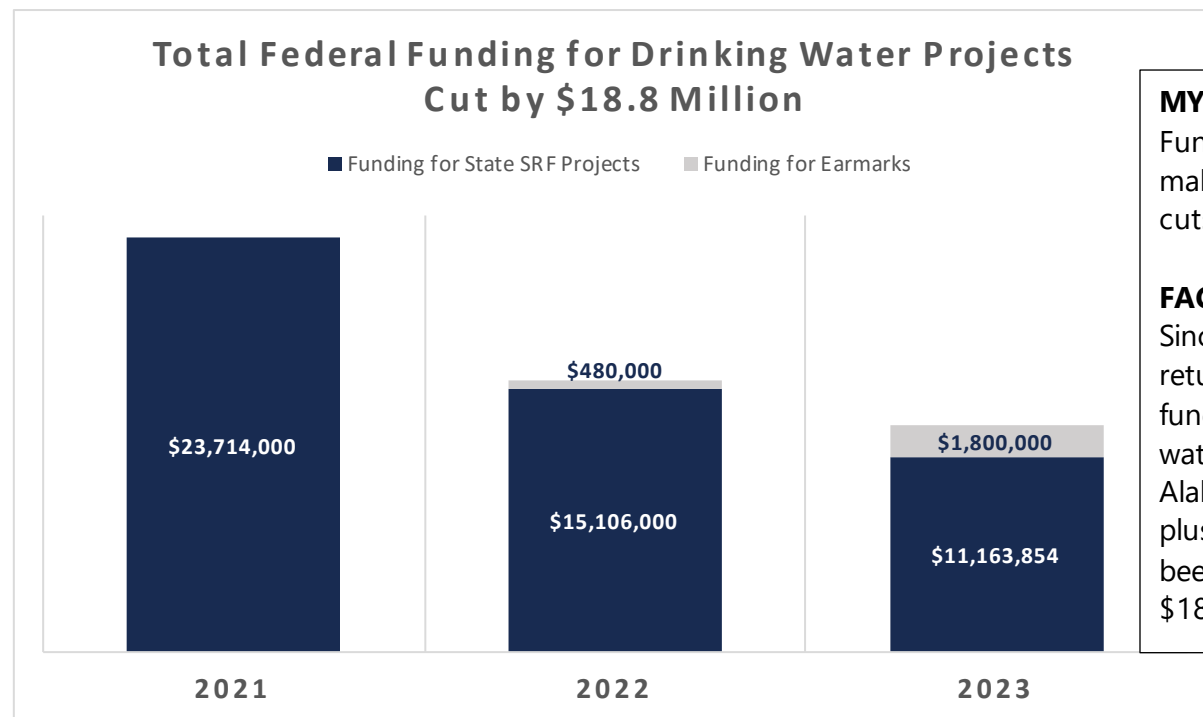
Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects.

# Alabama: Annual Federal Funding for Drinking Water Projects



**SINCE EARMARKS RETURNED**  
Over the last two years, more than \$21.1 million has been cut from the Alabama Drinking Water SRF to pay for earmarks.

Note: 2023 is an estimated allotment for state SRF projects based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.



**MYTH:**  
Funding for earmarks makes up for funding cuts to the SRFs.

**FACT:**  
Since earmarks returned in 2021, total funding for drinking water projects in Alabama (SRF funding plus earmarks) has been cut by more than \$18.8 million.

Note: The 2023 SRF allotment is an estimate based on the 2018-2022 allotment formula. A new allotment

formula will be adopted for 2023-2026.
